Dear Bethel Friends,

I was touched, once again, by your warm words of appreciation on Pastor Appreciation Day last month! Paul's words are my thoughts, too, and I give thanks to God for bringing us together. In this community of God's people Eric and I have found joy and gratitude and the grace of God! Thank you for wrapping your love around us. We already feel at home here and in the community.

November is known for its main holiday, Thanksgiving Day. Many of my friends extend that and post a daily thanks-giving on their social media pages. It's a good discipline to have, that "attitude of gratitude." It helps us see our lives for all that is positive and life-giving.

In worship this month we will also give thanks to God in some specific ways. On **All Saints Sunday, November 7th**, we will give thanks for the lives of the saints who have gone before us to their eternal home over the past two years. Most of these folks didn't have a public funeral, and some of you have mentioned how hard that has been to mourn their passing without that rite. While some funerals can be sad, the grief is softened a bit when we give thanks to God for giving us this person to know and to love in this life.

We will also give thanks for the gift of Holy Baptism on All Saints Sunday. This is the way we enter into the company of God's saints, becoming sisters and brothers with one another through Christ Jesus. **Please share a memento of your baptism that day.** For our at-home worshipers, we would love to have you send a photo and we'll find a way to share that.

Later in the month we will celebrate **Christ the King Sunday, November 21**. It's the last Sunday of the church year calendar when we give thanks for all the ways Jesus serves as the king we look to as our source of life. That Sunday we will journey through the church year with readings and hymns from each season—Advent to Christmas to Lent to Easter and through Ordinary Time—that reveal Christ as the Shepherd King, the Servant King, and the Victorious King.

Of course, every Sunday we celebrate the Great Thanksgiving in the meal of Holy Communion when all the saints of God gather to receive from Christ our King the food of his body and blood that empowers and sustains us in faith and love for God and our neighbor. I hope those worshiping at home have developed your own bread and wine to join us in this meal. If you would like some help with that, give me a call!

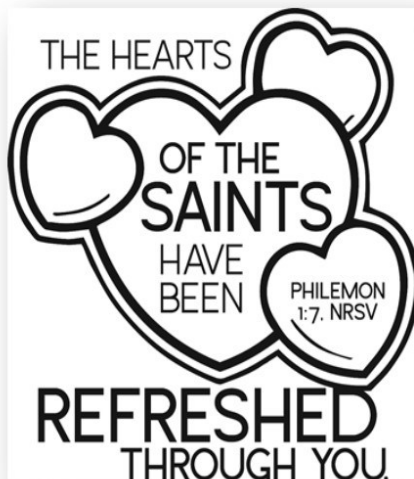

All Saints Sunday

November 7th

At baptism we are called into a special relationship with Christ. We are made "Holy", we are made "Saints".



On All Saint's Sunday, November 7, we celebrate the lives of all of our ancestors and those who have gone before us this past year. They were men and women who may have sat next to you in a pew, worshipped in same worship space, asked for forgiveness, and were cleansed through the same waters of baptism. We broke bread together and shared in the Lord's supper.

We say thanks for this worship space and the Christian inheritance they passed on to us. On All Saint's Sunday we are also reminded of baptism, set-apart for the service of God. We are reminded of our baptismal vows God himself calls us "Holy" and "Saints". Let us pray that we may remain faithful to our baptismal covenant and keep sharing Christ to the world.

Do you have special reminders of your Baptism day? Bring them to worship on November 7 to share with one another.

There will be tables set up in the gym where you can set up your display. Be sure to put your name or a short story on the table alongside the things you are sharing. It could simply be a photo, a candle, or a special gown that was handed down in your family.

We have just completed our Stewardship series and so we give thanks to the Bethel family for your spiritual practices that support our congregation and beyond. As we gather and go,

freely and easily, Bethel is thankful to have a place of worship for us to grow in faith. In this month of thankfulness, we give thanks for the leaders on our church council who help our congregation maintain the needs of the church as well as the community. We give thanks for Bible study leaders who plan lessons to encourage our spiritual maturity and we give thanks to the Bethel volunteers for being the gathering body of believers who are there to meet the needs of our various ministries.

One of the great themes of the Bible is that we are to be a people of Thanksgiving, not just one particular day of the year, but as Christians, we are to be thankful daily.

With Thanksgiving just around the corner it also means the Advent season will be upon us very soon. ***This year, the first Sunday of Advent is November 28.***

While most of the world around us will be in a full-throttle Christmas mode before they are even done with Thanksgiving dinner, I have shared with you for many years how I love the idea of peaceful waiting –

Last year at this time I wasn't sure how we could possibly celebrate Advent during the pandemic. How could we make merry when our hearts were heavy with sadness of not being able to worship together in person. We tried our best and delivered Advent to you in a box instead so it is with great excitement to be able to invite you to our Advent Fair in person this year!

Bethel invites you to take part in this peaceful waiting with us on Sunday, November 28 following the worship service. It is our hope that ***everyone of all ages*** will consider joining us on the first Sunday of Advent for our annual Advent Sharing Fair.

We will be making Advent centerpieces, wreathes, ornaments, and various activities in the gym to help you prepare for the season of waiting.

The basic idea of an Advent wreath is to mark the four Sundays of Advent in an intentional way by lighting candles, reading scripture, and saying prayers. What I love about the tradition of the Advent wreath is that it gives an instant sense of awe and specialness to the end of the day as you share prayers and scriptures with one another. In that moment of lighting the wreath, the noise and rush of the day settles into a soothing quiet moment. It's a good way to start a conversation with those around you about what they may have heard that day or how things are going in the business of their schedules. If you live alone, it's a wonderful time to share prayers and blessings with God. This small act of making an intentional time to observe Advent brings the meaning of the season into focus.

Advent matters because it's our way of keeping our eyes and our hearts and our arms all wide open as we prepare the way for Jesus.

Remember how no one had room for Mary and Joseph when they arrived and the people of Bethlehem were too busy with their own lives? We all get pretty busy too, so let's make room for Jesus this Advent.

Join us on Sunday, November 28 following the worship service for our annual wreath making and sharing activities for the Advent season. Watch for more information soon in the Mid-Week email.

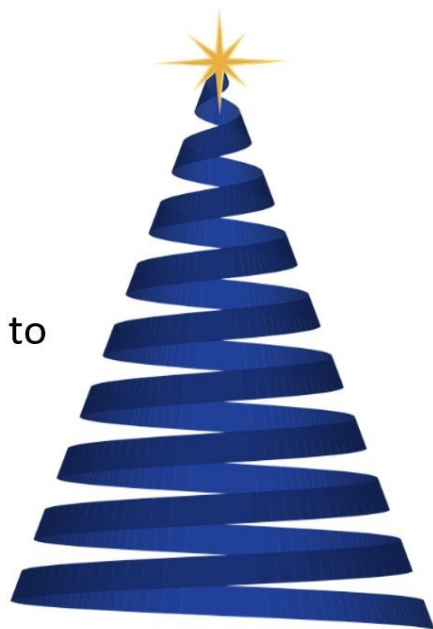

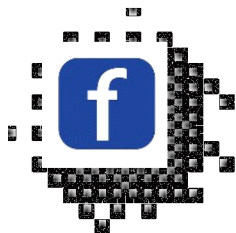

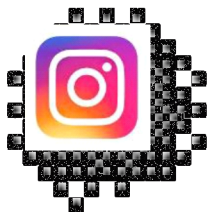

NOVEMBER GIVING CAMPAIGN

Dear Friends,

In less than two weeks, the 19th season of WHO begins. The Winter Hospitality Overflow [WHO] ministry is housed in both St. Paul and St. Andrew Lutheran Churches. This ecumenical ministry provides up to 80 of our most vulnerable neighbors with a safe, warm, and predictable place to rest. We operate during the coldest and wettest months of the year - November 1 through March 31. Each night St. Paul can serve 25-30 single men, and St. Andrew can serve 45-50 single women and families.

Thank you for your vigilant support of WHO. This year community support is more critical than ever. Local in-person fundraising and the annual Winds & Strings concert have been canceled because of COVID-19 and the surging delta variant.

There are plenty of examples of the pandemic's toll on this ministry. Even with increased safety and hygiene precautions, we cannot guarantee full staffing with volunteers. Our partners at SHARE and Outsiders Inn have generously agreed to provide staffing support in place of some volunteers. This will require continuing an increase in our expenses.

We need to raise \$50,000 this year to meet the additional expenses of WHO during Covid.
