



It means you could be an infant or 99! You are always welcome to come see what Family Ministry is all about!

Parents in our community are seeing the impact that social distancing has had on their kids. **Many desire opportunities to safely reconnect them to relationships.** Connection with people gives kids an understanding of their identity, belonging, and purpose.

**That's why VBS 2021 is crucial . . . Thank you Bethel family for supporting this ministry through your offerings of time and financial support. You are giving Bethel a chance to re-engage kids in new ways.**

VBS provides an opportunity to teach children about Jesus so that they can **learn ways to be like Christ**. "Jesus matured in wisdom and years, and in favor with God and with people" (Luke 2:52). **Children grow in wisdom as they experience teachings from the Bible**; they grow in divine favor as they discover more about God and God's amazing love for them, and they develop in favor with other people as they learn life application skills while interacting with them.

**You might be thinking that all sounds great for the kids, but why should I as an adult be interested in VBS?**

VBS has been an outreach tool into the community for many years at Bethel—a way to invite those who do not normally attend to come into Bethel's doors. **VBS is an opportunity for you to get involved and build relationships with others and with Jesus Christ.** There are so many ways the Bethel family can be involved as we build community and work together for the benefit of both children we know at Bethel and children we don't know.

I will be honest—VBS is hard work! Many of us stay up all night to prep all the supplies for transforming Bethel into all the various themes over the years. Some years we have been short on volunteers and we worked ourselves to exhaustion to recruit station leaders and crew leaders, but never fail, when the big week is finally finished, yes, we collapse into a VBS-induced coma. But we continue to do it anyway because **it's worth seeing all the smiles, hearing the laughter, witnessing the relationships that were developed and having conversations about Jesus. Those are the seeds were planted and hearts are transformed for eternity!**

**Crew Leaders are an essential part of making our VBS a success.** We need you, especially as we are learning new ways to plan a safe environment with all the protocols. See the VBS page to learn how to be a Crew Leader.

We are in the early stages of planning a modified in-person VBS June 21-23, 9:00 AM-12:00. We will need to keep the number of registrations in a smaller amount in order to stay safe and follow the faith-based protocols for Washington state. #### COVID Task Force Report:

Ken gave a run-down of the things to know right now. Attendance at church is now open. No reservations are needed. Thanks to Tara for her service in making the reservations! If too many people attend and overflow, we will adjust! There will still be sign-in sheets for tracking purposes.

#### Congregational Meeting:

Meeting is next Sunday April 18th. Zoomers will need to either come to church to cast a ballot or have someone take/pickup ballots. Kirsten will take minutes and Zoom attendance. Dave will begin an email thread to get people to volunteer to assist in the Congregational meeting. There is a question as to whether those on the phone patch can be considered to have attended the meeting and, therefore, be able to vote. There is conflicting information on that, and Dave will check with Pastor Shjerven and let her know that the phone patch is two ways.

Council meeting was temporarily suspended for Boards to meet.

#### Deacons

There was follow-up discussion on the Mutual Support Committee. Candi researched the committee by contacting other synods. SW WA synod did not have anything however; other synods passed on more information. Pastor should be a part of the decision to nominate the committee members. This committee will wait until our next Pastor is hired to proceed any further.

Jody Huffstutler will be resigning from the Board of Deacons. Remaining Deacons will be looking for a replacement. Jody's area of concern is Music and Worship.

Regarding former a tighter connection with the congregation, the Deacons have discovered that Judy Bergren keeps most women updated on the congregation through the prayer chain. There are fewer of Bethel's men receiving updates, however, Judy will be happy to contact them as well.

Candi will get the names of those 13 regulars who attend Bethel via the phone patch. She will reach out to them to let them know if and how they can vote at the Congregational meeting if they attend via the phone patch.

Bethel will verbally acknowledge Mother's and Father's Day this year, but not pass out any small gifts.

Lewisville Park is not taking group reservations for 2021, so the Church in the Park outing is cancelled this year.

#### Board of Parish Ed

More ideas for Sunday school were discussed. The "Wednesday Sunday school" classes won't end just yet. They are planning a few more Wednesdays before school is out this year.

VBS will happen this year! It will take place over June 21, 22, and 23, right after school is out.

COVID Protocols will be observed.



The Bethel Seniors will receive their quilts and be recognized in service this year. Several Rocksolid teens (8) are now involved thanks to Marcy, and they will also receive graduation quilts. She will arrange the delivery and recognition of their accomplishments.

Nursery - the Board will seek advice from the COVID task force on when they can actually open the nursery. Earl will need to find volunteers to staff the nursery first, then they can actually announce an opening.

#### Bonnie - Family Ministry

Bonnie is concerned about the lack of interaction between hers and Judy's computers. Power-Church isn't updating on both computers when changes are made. Chris Kast will check Bonnie's computer Sunday to see what might be going on. Regarding PowerChurch and other computer issues that are going on (Jim - overloaded gateway with trouble connecting new digital soundboard to network), Dave suggested Bethel look into hiring an IT person to periodically check our network. Donna will recommend someone she knows.

#### Trustees

Ken read a beautiful thank you note from Joe regarding his bonus for the extra services during Lent. Jim has been hired into an AV position for Bethel. Ken gave him a contract to sign, and the contract is retroactive to April 1st.

Bethel will be reimbursing Pastor Lynne's trip cost (\$975) from Montana to Brush Prairie.

Janitors are working at Bethel again. They put in about 6 hours once per week.

There will be a stewardship campaign in the future, but Jack would like to include an incoming Pastor in the planning. There will be more discussion about when the campaign might be held.

Ken gave a quick assessment of the visit we had from Pastor Lynne Ogren. It went quite well.

The compensation package was discussed. The base salary is close to that previously paid at Bethel. The compensation package is likely to be a little more because of increased insurance costs.


