### October Family Ministry



Galatians 6:9

Many of you know I grew up on a family farm and that Dennis and I raised a family of our own on the Stauffer family farm. At a young age I quickly learned the meaning of faith by witnessing the process of my dad preparing the soil, planting the seeds, cultivating the crops, harvesting the crops, and raising the animals. I have memories of my uncles and cousins inviting us to go along with them on a beach or camping trip. Instead of getting to go along on the trip, my dad would be

watching the weather to see if the rain the weatherman was predicting would ruin our hay crops. For nature did not always deliver sunshine when we needed it. There were other times though that we gave thanks for receiving just the right amount of rain and sunshine to grow the crops and enjoy fun times with our cousins.

Watching my parents have joyful accomplishments with the combination of sadness because of failures all those years ago and then again through the years with my husband as we raised our family on the farm, helped me learn how faith in God truly puts life in perspective. Even though my dad worked endlessly from sunrise to sunset—and my mom worked long hours as a nurse to provide for our family, they always made time on Sunday for worship. I watched and learned from my parents, my Grandma Ellen, and the many mentors and teachers I have had along the way at Bethel from the day of my baptism on July 5th, 1964 through this very day that I write to you in the Bethel Bell. I was raised in abundant soil where the roots of faith grew deep to live with a heart of love and compassion. Over the

years at Bethel you have taught me to serve others by teaching me that caring for those in need is a way of life. I have seen our Bethel members through these challenging times continue to show an abundant generosity for our congregation and our community. I give thanks for each of you who helped me receive just the right amount of sunshine by your love and support to help me continue to grow in my faith by being a witness to you serving. The results will be reviewed and a reopening plan will be presented to the council for review so that the council can determine reopening time based on the information and recommendations the task force provides.

### From Pastor Melanie Wallschlaeger at the Synod Office

September 2020

Dear Members of Bethel Lutheran Church,

In the August newsletter, I wrote a letter about the Church Council's recommendation that Vicar Vera McEwen be considered as the candidate for the regularly- called pastor position at Bethel. A Transition Team was put together to pursue the recommendation. The Transition Team's main priority was to listen to the congregation to hear if there was readiness and a sense of the Spirit's leading in that vision. The vision that Council and Vicar Vera had reached was one that built upon Bethel's engagement in the *Imagine* process, in which 50% of the pastor's time is dedicated to building disciples, incorporating new members, and evangelical outreach into the community. The Transition Team invited Vicar Vera to share her vision with the congregation through her Sunday preaching. Since the announcement of the *Imagine Covenant* vision for how Vicar Vera's time would be dedicated to outreach if she were to be called as Bethel's pastor, the Council and Transition Team have received input from multiple members. Through mutual discernment, Vicar Vera and Bethel's leaders have concluded that Vicar Vera's vision for evangelical outreach and mission does not match what Bethel feels is the pastoral model it desires for the next chapter. As a result, Bethel will not be engaging in the *Imagine Covenant* at this time and Vicar Vera will not be a candidate for call to Bethel.

The gift of this time of discernment is that Bethel leadership has a clearer idea of what direction the congregation wants to go and what work needs to be done in order to step out in faith in that direction. Vicar Vera also has clarity about how God is calling her to use her gifts as a pastor in a mission development/redevelopment context.

Congregational leaders I have heard from desire that Vicar Vera continue her work in interim ministry. She is willing to do so through the end of 2020. Vicar Vera's service as Bethel's Interim Minister will conclude on December 31 st, 2020. Having made the decision not to pursue the *Imagine Covenant* model, the Transition Team will meet with Bishop's Associate, Pastor Rebecca Shjerven, to engage in the work of the Ministry Site Profile. Once the Ministry Site Profile is complete, a Call Committee will be formed to begin the call process.

Please continue to keep Bethel in your prayers and hearts during this time of Spirit-led discernment.

### **About the PSALM Program**

The Southwestern Washington Synod seeks to form and support trustworthy, inclusive lay leaders who are grounded in Christian faith and in a Lutheran expression of faith. The Program for Strengthening Active Lay Ministry (PSALM) is designed for congregation members who have discerned a call to more intentional and public lay leadership in their congregation and community. The coursework for the term is introduced at a retreat by a variety of presenters who bring expertise to the topics. In addition to course assignments each term, students will work on practical ministry projects in their congregation or ministry setting. They will have an opportunity to share these projects with each other as part of the retreats.

Our Megan Zika is beginning her journey in the PSALM program. I asked Megan to tell us a little more about the program, her commitment, her costs, and her goals. Here is what she

told me..

The PSALM (program for strengthening active lay ministers) is 2 years long, split up into 4 quarters! At this point, it is in person, so that has brought the cost down from \$2000 to \$1320. I am so excited to start this program because it will be building upon what I have already learned from Concordia with my theology degree, and it will also be giving me the ELCA side of things which is something I realized I am

very passionate about after my time learning the LCMS side at CU-P. Rebecca Shjerven is one of my instructors and she let me know that they will be tailoring my program to be more in-depth because they know about my theology degree! I'm so excited!!! It will also be amazing to get to be in fellowship with people from all around our synod who are just as excited about the word and literacy in the word!
